PATROL COMPETITION POINT SYSTEM

Points are awarded to a Patrol on the basis of achievement of goals that support both the Scouting Program and the Patrol Method. Patrol Points are accumulated starting at a Troop Court of Honor. Just before the next Troop Court of Honor, total Patrol points are tallied and the winner(s) are announced at the next Troop Court of Honor. Troop Scout staff (SPL, ASPL, TG, JASM) do not participate in the Patrol Competition.

members. Only the active number of Scouts in a patrol will be considered as the number of Scouts in a patrol for competition purposes.

Method for Average:

Average = Total of Patrol members present at troop event / 10 (i.e., 10 in a patrol. 5 present = 50%; 50 / 10 = 5 points) (i.e., 8 in a patrol. 7 present = 88%; 88 / 10 = 8.8 or 9 points)

NOTES: Points can be given for most anything. Some judgment will be necessary to fairly assess each point situation. Sometimes the scores for a competition situation will have to be averaged.

When a patrol is putting on the program and competition occurs, the Program Patrol should get an average of all the patrol scores.

The Patrol Competition should be ended for the summer at the C/H in June or at the end of the school year and should be started again at the fall C/H.

In the summer, there should be Patrol/Crew competition on the high adventures and should definitely be held at summer camp; it will not be held on a regular basis as many Scouts are on vacation at various times and the patrol composition is often non-existent. Summer camp competition can be for the cleanest campsite each day, best looking uniforms per day, best packed canoe or backpack, most helpful Scouts, etc.

Point items out of the ordinary every day occurrence must be applied for by the Patrol Leader and given to the Scouter over seeing the Patrol Competition in order to get credit (i.e., helped on an Eagle Project).

THE WINNING PATROL'S AWARD:

The PLC in coordination with the Troop Committee establishes the award (i.e. how much will be spent) for the winning C/H patrol.

The winning patrol of at the Troop Court of Honor receives a blue ribbon, recognition, and the Patrol Competition Award.
